GENERAL RULES

1. Exhibits must be grown by exhibitor.
2. Fresh cut exhibits must be placed in bottle not vase; one stem per bottle
3. Plants must be groomed (remove bad looking foliage and all leaves from stem that may be submerged in water)
4. Exhibits must be brought to the fair **Wednesday Sept 9 4pm-7pm or Thursday Sept 10 9am-1pm**
5. Check-in time can be shortened if the exhibitor will make a list of each flower and its classification ahead of time.
6. Please refer to the "Entry Information" sheet in this premium listing. Address labels can be used on the tags to identify plant owner.

CUT FLOWERS

A. Chrysanthemums

1. Button (small, flat, short-petal, measuring 1 to 1½ inches diameter)
2. Pompons (typically globular, usually not over 4 inches)
3. Single (not more than five rows of long petals around a large disk)
4. Double and Semi-Double (showing almost no center)
5. Anemone-type (short petals, large usually raised disk)
6. Spoon (ray florets open at end to form spoon like tips)
7. Spider (florets long, tubular, curved or twisted, definitely coiled)
8. Quills (florets elongated, tubular, tips may be closed to the tip)

B. ROSES

1. Hybrid Tea
2. Polyanthus
3. Floribundas
4. Climbers or Ramblers
5. Miniature

C. DAHLIAS

1. Blooms over 8 inches
2. Blooms over 4 inches and under 8 inches
3. Blooms under 4 inches
